

**Proposed Civil VMJI No. 9.000 General Personal Injury and Property Damage**

[If you find your verdict for the plaintiff, then, in] [In] determining the damages to which he is entitled, you shall consider any of the following which you believe by the greater weight of the evidence was caused by the negligence of the defendant:

- (1) any bodily injuries he sustained,
- (2) and their effect on his health according to their degree and probable duration;
- (3) any physical pain he suffered in the past;
- (4) any physical pain he may be reasonably expected to suffer in the future;
- (5) any mental anguish he suffered in the past;
- (6) any mental anguish he may be reasonably expected to suffer in the future;
- (7) any disfigurement or deformity,
- (8) and any associated humiliation or embarrassment he suffered in the past,
- (9) and any associated humiliation or embarrassment that he may be reasonably expected to suffer in the future;
- (10) any inconvenience caused in the past;
- (11) any inconvenience that probably will be caused in the future;
- (12) any medical expenses incurred in the past;
- (13) any medical expenses that may be reasonably expected to occur in the future;
- (14) any earnings he lost because he was unable to work at his calling;
- (15) any loss of earnings and lessening of earning capacity, or either, that he may reasonably be expected to sustain in the future; and
- (16) any property damage he sustained.

Your verdict shall be for such sum as will fully and fairly compensate the plaintiff for the damages sustained as a result of the defendant's negligence.
